


Most agreed comment with **57 agreements**: This road needs better pedestrian facilities, including wider pavements, safe road crossings and less congestion.



Manage risks from user data

New legislation in effect from May 2018 is a major risk for those collecting and processing user data.

- **High fines**: \in 20m fine for breaches.
- Affects ALL user data: digital and paper. Essential for consultation
- Tough standards: data encryption, no spreadsheets.
- **Respondents have full control**: Respondents can manage/remove their data





Commonplace solution

Manages all personal information and removes all risks.
